



## **MENTOR INFORMATION**

Volunteering as a preparedness mentor is a rewarding opportunity to assist NACCHO and the local public health preparedness community. Mentors will oversee a small team of new preparedness coordinators and provide technical assistance and guidance to all members of their team throughout the duration of the program. These coordinators will generally have less than two years of public health preparedness experience. The process allows you to interact with other experienced mentors, share your expertise and knowledge with those new to the preparedness field, and have access to program resources.



## **ELIGIBILITY**

Applicants must meet the following criteria in order to be eligible to be a mentor for Roadmap to Ready:

- Have at least five years of public health preparedness experience, preferably at the local or regional level;
- Prior experience in the preparedness coordinator role (or equivalent) preferred, but not required;
- Agree to commit to all program responsibilities.



## **MAJOR RESPONSIBILITIES**

- Travel to and participate in an in-person workshop;
- Provide mentoring and guidance for a small team of new preparedness coordinators;
- Coordinate mentor team learning and sharing opportunities to address challenges faced by program participants;
- Provide guidance and feedback to mentees through monthly team engagement calls;
- Be willing to commit 30-35 hours of time over the course of the year.
