



PARTICIPANT INFORMATION

Participating in NACCHO's Roadmap to Ready is a great opportunity to gain access to resources and information that may assist you in your role as a local public health preparedness coordinator. The program uses a blended learning methodology, including an in-person workshop, coaching and mentorship from experienced preparedness coordinators from around the country, and tailored resources. If accepted into the program, you will be assigned to a mentor who has committed to provide technical assistance and guidance to all members of their team throughout the duration of the program.



ELIGIBILITY

Applicants must meet the following criteria in order to be eligible to participate in Roadmap to Ready:

- Be currently employed at a local/regional health department as a preparedness coordinator(or other equivalent preparedness role);
- Have less than two years of local public health preparedness experience (as of January 2019);
- Agree to commit to all program responsibilities.



MAJOR RESPONSIBILITIES

- Travel to and participate in an in-person workshop;
- Develop, with your mentor's support, an individual action plan with monthly tasks to improve public health emergency preparedness in your community;
- Participate in monthly calls with your mentor team following the workshop to share progress and challenges in completing your action plan;
- Be willing to commit 30 hours of time over the course of the year.
